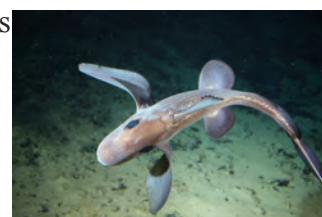

### “Deep Sea Ocean Life” by Mary Conner Also an intro to Encaustic Wax Painting

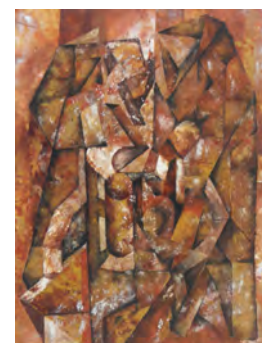
Members will be treated to a photo show documenting two deep sea submarine dives to depths of 2,000 and 2,300 feet, taken by artist Mary Conner and her husband in Roatan Island, Honduras, last June. At that depth, you see some amazing things! Mary will show slides of the animal species that she encountered and describe interesting characteristics that enable them to survive at those depths. So many of these creatures have interesting stories and many are not what they appear - some animals look more like plants.



Mary earned Ph.D.s in organic chemistry and human genetics and was a clinical chemist at a hospital for five years and a professor of genetic toxicology at the University of Pittsburgh for 17 years. She has always had an interest in ocean exploration and a fascination with the unusual species present in that environment. This interest inspired her to take the deep sea dives that will enable us to enjoy her fantastic creatures!

In addition, Mary will give us a short description of the process of encaustic wax, that is, art made through the revitalization of an ancient process of painting with melted wax, and show some of the wonderful work she has done, using this very interesting medium. Come enjoy our underwater excursion and learn what encaustic wax is all about!

### Judge's Comments:

"This is indeed one of the finest 'mini shows' I have seen and also the most difficult to judge," says Color Splash judge Ernie Baudhuin. "The entries were all beautiful! You are to be congratulated on a very outstanding exhibit."

Ernie Baudhuin's highly respected career as an artist spans more than 70 years. All told, he estimates he has created more than three hundred paintings. And those paintings have won numerous awards.

Ernie has another claim to fame. He created the logo of the Super Bowl XLV Champion Green Bay Packers.

Ernie's style has evolved over the years. "At first I painted exclusively with pastels, but one of my clubs challenged me to get into watercolor," he recalls. "I loved it. I combined pastel with watercolor, but I do primarily watercolor now.

I also like working with acrylics because they dry faster."

Ernie has always given much back to the community. He has taught art and mentored many students here in Palm Coast through Adult Education. He also played an important role in the growth of the Flagler County Art League.

## FEATURED ARTIST WIN JONES



### *Win Jones Shares Artistic Vision and Watercolor Techniques with FCAL Members, Prior to Opening of Retrospective*

Win Jones, prominent St. Augustine artist, treated FCAL members to a discussion of his unique watercolor techniques and the concepts behind his work, during FCAL's general meeting in February. His talk was an introduction of a retrospective show of his work debuting that weekend at FCAL's new City Marketplace Gallery.

The retrospective, a collection entitled "Keepers," which ran throughout the rest of the month featured a select group of paintings considered landmarks in the developing style of this self-taught artist. The work spanned the years from 1960 to the present. Though the exhibit was relatively small compared with his last museum retrospective, it was impressive both stylistically and as a conceptual presentation.

Much of his earlier work featured a dry brush technique, a very laborious process, he noted. Use of stencils helped create a linear quality in his surrealist work. Social and ecological consciousness played a major role in his subject matter of the 60s and '70s. For example, his iconic painting, "The American Yard," part of his American Wasteland series, includes subtly rendered images of the caskets of President John F. Kennedy, Robert Kennedy and Martin Luther King. Another image reflecting the Vietnam era depicts soldiers in the ground, with the flag covering them.

During the 80s, Win experimented with space and time, for example, people entering and leaving the frame, as in his Subway Series. Time and space also underscored an ethereal series of paintings in which women in Victorian costume were placed out of context, in 20th century settings.

Such juxtapositions aim to keep viewers "off balance," Win pointed out.

In more recent paintings, such as a stunning series of New England seascapes and lighthouses, Win utilized a wet on wet technique to achieve his haunting effects.

It is the marriage of unique style and visionary thinking that enables the creation of multilayered work, Win concluded. "Feeder ideas—things that interest you—pursue them," he told FCAL members. "You don't know where they will go."

### **Background:**

Jones is a professor of art Emeritus who taught at Northern Illinois University for over 20 years, retiring in 1990. He first came to St. Augustine in the early 80's when he acted as juror for the Arts and Crafts Festival there. Since then, he has conducted workshops and has juried shows across the First Coast and Florida. His works are still unique among watercolorists today and are represented in seven museum collections as well as civic, corporate, and private collections across the country. He is an FCAL member
